The Feline Conservation Center is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) wild feline breeding facility operated by the Exotic Feline Breeding Compound (EFBC).

Natural habitat cages offer close-up viewing of some of the world's rarest cats. We are located in Rosamond, California, just over an hour's drive north of Los Angeles

on Highway 14 (the Antelope Valley freeway). EFBC/FCC houses more than 70 wild cats ranging in size from the diminutive margay to larger species such as leopards, tigers, and jaguars. Visit EFBC/FCC and learn more about some of nature's most majestic creatures. Our Amur leopard, Jaguar, Fishing Cat, and Pallas' Cat breeding programs are renowned worldwide.

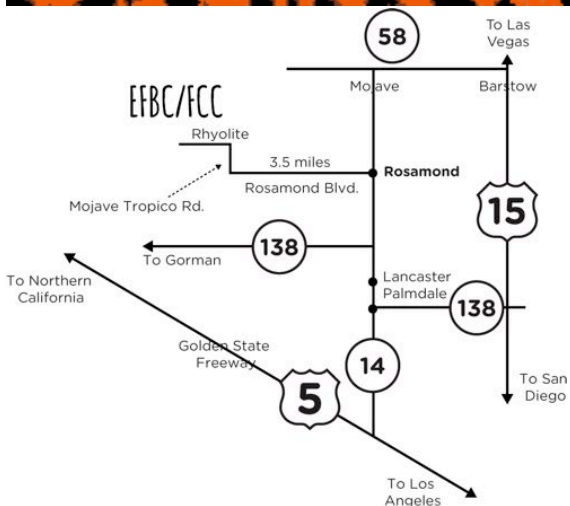
